**CALL 911 for any Police, Fire,

Suspicious Activity or Non-emergencies

972-1411

Call the police immediately if you see anything suspicious in your neighborhood! Report non-emergency matters to the Rocky Mount Police Department anytime of the day or night at 972-1411.

Stray Animals

972-1390

The City's "leash law" requires dog owners to keep dogs on a leash or on their own property. Call this number to report loose animals. After working hours, call 972-1411.

Crimestoppers

977-1111

Crime Stoppers is a recorded crime tip line created to help solve and prevent crimes. Callers do not have to give their name.

Dumped Furniture

467-4950

The City will collect discarded furniture, mattresses, and appliances at the curb. Call this number to tell Public Works crews that you have something that needs to be collected.

Loose Leaf Collection

467-4906

Loose leaf collection occurs in the months of November, December and March. Call this number for collection schedules or more information.

Recycling & Garbage

467-4950

Learn what you can recycle in your curbside bin, and help keep recyclable materials out of the landfill. You can recycle newspapers, magazines, glass, plastic, and much more! Call this number to learn more.

How to Report Suspicious Activity:

Give the address or a description of the location you are calling about.

Give a detailed description of the event or suspect. This is important because it helps the police know how best to respond.
